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Proposed Development on the Fast Eddie's Site

MidAtlantic Realty Partners, LLC has proposed a change to the comprehensive plan for the site between North Kings Highway and Richmond Highway where Fast Eddie's in currently located. They have proposed that the area extending down to Papa John's be re-planned from low rise office and retail uses to a mix of multifamily residential use with ground floor retail at an intensity three to five times greater than currently allowed.

The proposed plan includes a maximum of 360 residential units in buildings 4-5 stories in height and up to 40,000 square feet of retail and office use. The proposed development would be served by a limited amount of surface parking with the majority of spaces provided in underground parking structures beneath the buildings.

Since this area is in the Mount Vernon District, it did not come before the Lee District Land Use Committee, even though it is just across the boundary from Lee District.

The major Lee District concern would be the increased traffic. The intent is that the new development traffic will not enter and exit from Richmond Highway. While the development would be projected to create less new traffic than that allowed under the current comprehensive plan, it will create more, and perhaps much more, traffic than the site now does with its existing retail facilities. The residential units are projected to produce 2,305 vehicle trips per day, the office space 227 trips per day, and the ground floor retail 3,105 trips per day, for a total of 5,637 trips per day. 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Services Changed to the Kingstowne Post Office

Since June 2012, many services performed by the the Franconia Post Office (5221 Franconia Rd) have been transferred to the Kingstowne Post Office at 5900 Barcay Drive. All mail delivery personnel work out of the Kingstowne Post Office. All certified, registered, express, and held mail (for example, mail held while you are on vacation) that was previously held at the Franconia Post Office must now be picked-up at the Kingstown Post Office.


Services still performed at the Franconia Post Office include post office boxes, counter service (stamps, sending registered and certified mail, sending packages and express mail, etc.) and passports (call ahead to make a time-slot reservation for passports).

The zip code for a Virginia Hills address will remain unchanged, 22310 or 22306.

The Kingstowne Post Office is about the same distance from Virginia Hills. Heading south on Telegraph Road, turn right onto South Van Dorn Street. Make the first left onto King Center Drive, then make the second right onto Barclay Drive. If you reach Kingstowne Blvd, you've gone too far.

Attempts by the *Echo* to obtain comment from the Postal Service on the reason for this change went unanswered. However, given the recent service cutbacks and closures by the Postal Service in light of its precarious financial condition, this change may well be related.

Hours for the Kingstowne Post Office are 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM weekdays and 9:00 AM - 2:30 PM Saturdays. Hours for the Franconia Post Office are 9:00 AM - 6:00 PM weekdays and 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM Saturdays.


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


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How Virginia Hills Voted in November

Is Your Trash or Recycling Container Broken or Missing?

If so, as a County collection customer, the County will repair or replace your container for free. Once you've notified them of the problem, a crew will come by on collection day and make the repair or replace the container.

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E-ZPass for the Express Lanes on the Beltway

Have you been thinking about using the new express lanes on I-495 between Springfield and the Dulles Toll Road or continuing on to I-495 crossing the Cabin John Bridge? If so, you'll need an E-ZPass, a device (transponder) that you attach to your windshield and will send a radio signal that will notify the toll collection equipment where you enter and exit the express lanes.

If you already have an E-ZPass, it will work on the new express lanes and you may use it until its battery dies. Battery life can easily exceed 10 years, so your transponder may not need to be exchanged for a long time. As long as you keep your old transponder, you won't have to pay the 50 cents per month service change that applies to new transponders.

If you are car-pooling at HOV-3 level (3 persons in the car), you'll need an E-ZPass Flex that switches between the carpool mode (free) and normal mode (toll).

If you don't have an E-ZPass, you'll need to get one. There are four different ways.

Call 1-877-762-7824

Visit one of the Service Centers or DMV partner locations. The closest service center is at 610 Herndon Parkway, Suite 900, Herndon, VA 20170. The nearest partner DMV is 1968 Gallows Road in Vienna.

Pick up a transponder at an E-ZPass On-the-Go retailer and register it on-line or by phone. Current retailers are AAA, Giant, and Wegmans. The closest Giant is the one in Kingstowne. The closest AAA is at 2231 Eisenhower Ave.

E-ZPass has a far greater reach than just the I-495 express lanes. It works at all toll roads, bridges, and tunnels in Virginia and in Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and West Virginia.

To open an E-ZPass account online or at a Service Center, you'll need to pre-pay a minimum of \$35 in tolls. You can set up the account to automatically refresh itself from a credit card when the balance in the account begins to run low.

Given the recently approved development on North Kings north of the Penn Daw Plaza reported in the April Echo, there is a strong chance that this second development will cause serious traffic problems on North, and possibly South, Kings Highway.

The comprehensive plan envisions that South Kings Highway will be re-routed so that it will not connect to North Kings, but rather run into Richmond Highway in the vicinity of Krispy Kreme. This would reduce the traffic from North Kings moving onto South Kings and into our neighborhood. However, there is no funding allocated for this change and it is difficult to say when it will be implemented, if ever.

The owner of the Papa John's site has not at this point sold the property to MidAtlantic, and if the sale does not take place, it is likely that Papa John's intends to remain at its current location.

The Board of Supervisors was scheduled to vote on this comprehensive plan amendment for the Fast Eddie's site as the Echo went to press. If the Board votes on it, it is likely to pass. Additional information on the outcome of the vote should be available at the Association meeting on the 11th.

Message from Supervisor McKay

Sequestration is \$600 billion of tax increases and spending cuts that go into effect next year if Congress does not act. It's part of the fiscal cliff—the combination of sequestration, tax cuts that expire and the federal debt ceiling.

On October 23, the County's Economic Advisory Commission addressed the potential impact. Dr. Stephen Fuller, Director of the Center for Regional Analysis at George Mason University's School of Public Policy, told us that no region is as vulnerable as Northern Virginia (40% of the D.C. metro area's economy is linked to federal spending).

In FY2011, the County received \$289.6 million from the federal government. Should that revenue drop, we would have to adjust our budget and services to address short and long term funding issues. While only 1% of our General Fund revenue comes from the federal government, many Fairfax County public schools programs rely on federal dollars. There are also significant federal grant dollars in our budget and our residents receive federally funded services. We are most concerned with reductions of federal funds for schools, human services, grants, and housing.

If we avoid the sequester, we are still likely to see federal cuts to state and local governments; Virginia's cuts would be in the neighborhood of \$1 billion.

I can't guess what the lame duck or 113th Congress will do—my crystal ball is still in the shop for service. My colleagues and I have been watching the potential for a sequester for some time. At our September FY2012 carryover budget review we set a \$7 million reserve to ensure that we would be able to continue critical services.

We are like a household with maxed out credit cards and bills that can no longer be put off—we must get a handle on our debt. The challenge at every level of government is to do that without sending the economy into recession and shredding the safety net needed by so many of our residents. It's going to demand extraordinary amounts of creativity, hard work, and shared sacrifice. Can we do it? I believe we can.
